

John James Woodward Prize

About the Scholarship

The John James Woodward Prize is to be awarded to a 'high achieving' student who is studying subjects which deal with the preservation of the Environment and, in particular, in the field of Australian Flora and who is in need of some financial assistance to further their studies in this area'.

The prize is awarded to a student who is undertaking studies in *natural resource management, forestry or horticulture*, which focus on the *preservation of the environment*; preference is given to studies dealing with the *preservation of Australian flora*; the prize is awarded to a student who is in need of *financial assistance* to continue their studies.

To determine financial need, students must submit an online [Student Financial Assessment](#) form (click on hyperlink) and applications will be assessed and ranked by Scholarships & Bursaries.

Eligibility

The John James Woodward Prize is open for award annually to a high achieving student or students who are interested in the preservation of the environment and are in financial need. Preference will be given to candidates that have not received this award before.

To be eligible for this scholarship, you must:

- undertake studies in agriculture, natural resource management, forestry or horticulture, which focus on the preservation of the environment
